The Tribal Information Sharing and Analysis Center (Tribal-ISAC) is a division of not-for-profit Tribal Share, Inc. Tribal-ISAC is THE information security sharing community for Tribes. The mission of Tribal-ISAC is to improve the overall security posture of Tribes with an emphasis on cybersecurity, but including all-hazard threats and risks.

Tribal-ISAC is governed by Tribal Share, Inc. a 501(c)(3) with the following objectives:

- Sharing of community security threat information and intelligence in a safe and secure environment among the nations Native American and Alaska Native tribes
- Improving the security posture of all Native American and Alaska Native tribes to better protect their critical national infrastructure

- Managing the collaboration with other industry Industry Security and Analysis Center organizations (“ISAC”) and federal, state, local and territorial resources and agencies to improve resilience and preparedness of tribes across the nation
- A platform for providing more opportunity, education, resources and sharing activities to the benefit of Native American or Alaska Native tribes or tribal citizens.

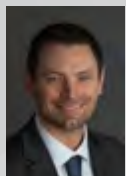
